

Fan Sweatshirt Jacket

Purchase a sweatshirt with set in sleeves, no drop shoulders and no raglan sleeves. Select a sweatshirt that is large and long enough to fit you as a jacket, usually one size larger than you normally wear.

Machine wash and dry the sweatshirt and all fabrics. This will eliminate a future shrinkage problem. In the first class we will be taking the sweatshirt apart.

For the first class you will need to bring:

Fan Sweatshirt Jacket pattern available at Sew Hut

8 cotton coordinating fabrics- 3/8 yds each fabric

1 1/8 yds of contrasting fabric is needed for stripping and binding (most sizes).

Note: For larger sizes increase to 1/2 yard of each fabric. I used a darker color to set off the fan pieces, but you can use any color you like.

Sewing machine and walking foot

6" and 12" ruler and a tape measure

Scissors and seam ripper for taking sweatshirt apart

Chalk marker or a marker that can be used on sweatshirt fabric

90/14 universal needles

Thread to match color of sweatshirt and fabric

For the second class you will need to bring:

4 buttons 3/4" I covered my buttons with fabric

Iron and pressing board. There are two irons in class, but there will be a lot of pressing so you may want to bring your small iron. The iron will not be needed until the second class.

I work on Tuesday and Saturdays, please call me or see me on one of those days. I need to know if you have ever made a sweatshirt jacket before.



Sweatshirts are seasonal item, I did find some at Sears Essentials though.

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
